<u>ACT 1</u>

(Ezra enters)

EZRA: Your majesty...

- KING: Ezra....come... be seated (*pause*)...I am well aware of your great devotion to God and how much respect you have for his Law...I also know how you study the Scriptures and your great ability to explain to others the meaning of the Scriptures.
- EZRA: Thank you, your majesty.
- KING: And because of your qualities, Ezra, I am sending you to Jerusalem. The people there are trying to rebuild the temple of God. You will need to find out as much as you can about them. Are they all working together? Is there any unrest or conflict? Do they still obey the Law of God?
- EZRA: Yes, your majesty.
- KING: But be prepared, Ezra. These people might have lost faith...
- EZRA: Lost faith? In God?
- (The King nods)

EZRA:	Why?	
KING:	Their lives have been far from easy. They have suffered hardship, their homes have been destroyed and their temple was left in ruins.	
EZRA:	It sounds as though God has tested their faith.	
KING:	Do you think so?	
EZRA:	He will do that, from time to time	
KING:	Explain that to me	
EZRA:	God's will is sometimes very hard to understand let alone accept	
KING:	Are you saying something bad could happen to a good person?	
(Ezra nods)		

EZRA:	Yes, it can.	
KING:	And would that be God's will?	
ERZA:	It could be, but God will have a reason. He always has. And that is the hardest part because only He knows what that reason is.	
KING:	What do you say to that person? How do you tell them that God has not turned His back on them?	
EZRA:	It depends, your majesty	
KING:	On what?	
ERZA:	On how much faith the person has in God.	
(Pause)		
KING:	You have spoken to me about God many times, Ezra. I am always very interested in what you say about him. He must be very powerful	
EZRA:	Yes, but He will always care for those who love and serve Him.	
KING:	Does that mean you will need none of my soldiers to go with you and protect you on your journey?	
(Ezra shakes his he	ead)	
KING:	As you wish, Ezra. I do not wish to displease your God	
EZRA:	He is not my GodHe is there for everyone	
KING:	I see,, but as a gesture of good will I make sure that you have enough gold and silver to take with you and use in the temple of God.	
EZRA:	Thank you, your Majesty	
KING:	Not only do I want you to find out about the people. Ezra, I also want you to initiate a religious reformation. You will need to teach the laws of God to all the ignorant people	
EZRA:	I will teach as many as I caneven the Gentiles	

The Gentiles? You will find Gentiles and Jews have married each KING: other.



- EZRA: Surely not. The Law of God does not allow this, your majesty...It is very important that the Law of God is heard by everyone,...
- KING: But not everyone is prepared to listen.
- EZRA: I know but the lives of those people would change by listening. The Word of God does so many things. It helps you to live your life, gives you strength and a purpose, and keeps you from sin.
- KING: I doubt if I will ever meet anyone with a greater devotion than you, Ezra. If these people don't listen to you then they won't listen to anyone.

- RACHEL: Are you going to the market today, Abigail?...
- ABIGAIL: I don't know....I haven't decided....
- RACHEL: Do you have to?
- ABIGAIL: Probably....it's the thought of coming back home and knowing Jacob won't be back later...
- RACHEL: It must be so hard for you.
- ABIGAIL: It is, Rachel, but when I am with you, I can now talk to you without thinking of him... there was a time when I couldn't....
- RACHEL: So how have you been able to do that? Is it time? (*pause*) They do say time is a great healer...
- ABIGAIL: Do they? But doesn't that mean you, one day, get your old life back? That will never happen...
- RACHEL: No, it won't...
- ABIGAIL: I feel I've been thrown into a fire and the heat is so strong it changes you and your life. There's nothing you can do about it.
- RACHEL: But how do you adjust to your new life?

(Solomon & Nathan enter)

SOLOMON:	When did he tell you this?	
NATHAN:	Today	
RACHEL:	What's happened, Nathan?	
NATHAN;	Adam does not want to work with us anymore	
RACHEL:	Doesn't he?	
NATHAN:	He's not the only one. Gideon and Seth don't want to, either.	
SOLOMON:	What? All three of them? But re-building the Temple of God is so important	
NATHAN:	Not to themnot anymore	
RACHEL:	Did they all tell you this, Nathan?	
NATHAN:	No, only Adam, but he spoke for the three of them.	
SOLOMON:	What did he say?	
NATHAN:	They've lost faith.	
SOLOMON:	They've what?	
NATHAN:	I said, they've all had a loss of faith	
SOLOMON:	in what exactly?	
NATHAN:	In God	
SOLOMON:	 How can they? They live by his laws	
NATHAN:	They think He's turned their back on them	
SOLOMON:	Is that what they told you?	
(Nathan nods)		
NATHAN:	Look at what has happened to their homesthe temple	

SOLOMON:	But God didn't do that		
NATHAN:	They don't think God wants us to restore the Temple		
SOLOMON:	Of course He doesthey must not lose faith		
ABIGAIL:	I'm not surprised they haveI never thought I would		
SOLOMON:	Is that how you feel too, Abigail?		
ABIGAIL:	SometimesI know I shouldn'tbut I can't help it		
(Leah enters)			
LEAH:	Hello		
RACHEL:	Hello dear		
NATHAN:	Hello Leah		
RACHEL:	Where's Daron?		
LEAH:	He's still working		
RACHEL:	Still working? That husband of yours works so hard		
LEAH:	I know but he really enjoys what he does		
RACHEL:	We hardly see him		
NATHAN:	We haven't offended him, have we?		
LEAH:	Of course not, Father		
SOLOMON:	Sounds as though he is the sort of person we need		
NATHAN:	But we can't have		
(Solomon looks at Nathan)			
SOLOMON:	Oh that's rightwe can't, can we?he's a Gentile		
NATHAN:	Had you forgotten?		
SOLOMON:	Well, we need someone to help us		

<u>ACT 3</u>

LEAH:	Do you think Father will be back soon?	
RACHEL:	I don't think so, dear. There aren't as many helping now	
LEAH:	Yes, you did tell me	
RACHEL:	It's come as quite a shock to your Father	
LEAH:	What's going to happen?	
RACHEL:	It means that all the work will take longer to do it might even mean that Solomon will have to work	
LEAH:	Doesn't he help Father?	
RACHEL:	As a leader, I think he believes he should be telling people what to do and not do any of the work himself	
LEAH:	Really?	
RACHEL:	Your Father would probably disagree,,,	
LEAH:	So, Mother, why do you think that?	
RACHEL:	it's just the way Solomon talks to your Fathertelling him what to do, telling him what the other workers must do	
LEAH:	But He is a leader	
RACHEL:	If he is a leader, then why did Adam and the other two men tell your Father they were going to stop working? Why didn't they tell Solomon?	
LEAH:	Father was easier to talk to?	
RACHEL:	And then for Solomon to forget that Daron is a Gentile	
LEAH:	Yes, I was surprised too	
RACHEL:	Did you tell Daron?	
LEAH:	(abruptly) Oh No! I don't think he would have wanted to hear that	
RACHEL:	He's not working too hard, is he?	

LEAH:	I think he probably is	
RACHEL:	Have you told him?	
LEAH:	I wouldn't do that	
RACHEL:	You don't think there's any other reason?	
LEAH:	What are you getting at, Mother?	
RACHEL:	I thoughtwell, we thought	
LEAH:	You and Father?	
(Rachel nods)		
RACHEL:	We thought by working so hard, he wouldn't have time to see us	
LEAH:	Do you and Father really think that?	
RACHEL:	We haven't offended him, have we Leah?	
LEAH:	No, Mother	
RACHEL:	We were thinking it might have been something we said	
(Leah shakes her head)		
RACHEL:	You would tell us, wouldn't you?	
(Ezra enters)		
EZRA:	Hello	
RACHEL:	Hello	
EZRA:	My name is Ezra.	
RACHEL:	I'm Rachel and this is my daughter, Leah…I'm sorry but I don't recognise your face…	
EZRA:	I don't live here I have been sent by King Artaxerxes	
LEAH:	The king?	
(Ezra nods)		
EZRA:	Yes, he is well aware of what has happened to your people and he wants to know how you are coping.	



RACHEL: It has been a struggle....a real struggle.....

EZRA: I'm sure it has..

- LEAH: We've tried to get with on our lives but it hasn't been easy...There's been no one to turn to...
- EZRA: What about God?
- (Silence)
- EZRA: Haven't you prayed to him?
- LEAH: I have done.....
- RACHEL: So did I... but you will find that most people have...
- EZRA: stopped praying? (pause) What about your husbands?
- RACHEL: My husband, Nathan, is helping to restore the Temple...so we haven't completely lost our faith in God...
- EZRA: But you don't pray as often as you did
- (Rachel nods)
- EZRA: What about your husband, Leah?
- LEAH: He doesn't pray at all....
- EZRA: Doesn't he?
- LEAH: He's a Gentile....
- EZRA: Is he?.....But you're a Jew, aren't you?
- (Leah nods)
- EZRA: So how did this happen? What made you marry him? You, Leah, have a relationship with God.... he does not.
- LEAH: But he is a good man....he really is. He works very hard in the field... I think he works too hard.....
- EZRA: Really?
- LEAH: He needs to find someone to help him....



(Solomon enters)

SOLOMON: Hello Rachel... Hello Leah..

EZRA: Hello, my name is Ezra...

(Ezra and Solomon shake hands)

SOLOMON: I'm Solomon..I'm one of the Leaders..I haven't seen you before.

EZRA: I have been sent by the King to find out what is happening here.

- SOLOMON: The King! We are very honoured! You must be aware that we are trying to re-build the temple.., Allow me to show you what we have done..
- EZRA: Yes, I would like to see how much progress you have made.
- SOLOMON: Of course. Although progress is slow, I can say that we are all working very hard....
- RACHEL: (Looking at Solomon) All?
- SOLOMON: The spirits of the people are quite low.
- EZRA: I will try and lift their spirits...that is why I am here.
- SOLOMON: That won't be easy.
- EZRA: I will try to convince them that what they are doing is God's will. They might not think it now but I can tell you that God is with them.

(Ezra and Solomon leave together)

<u>ACT 4</u>

LEAH :	There you are
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DARON: Hello Leah...

(Leah and Daron hug each other)

LEAH:	Did you have a good day? The weather must have helped.	
DARON:	It did	
LEAH:	I went to see my Mother	
DARON:	Did you?	
LEAH:	She is on her own when Father is away at work, isn't she? So I thought she might like the company	
(Silence)		
LEAH:	Daron, are you alright? You're very quiet	
DARON:	I'm just tired	
LEAH:	You work such long hours.	
DARON:	because there is so much to do	
LEAH:	Can't you find anyone to help you?	
DARON:	It would take too much time anyway, not all the workers are Gentiles	
LEAH:	So a Jewish worker wouldn't work with you? Is that what you're saying?	
(Daron nods)		
LEAH:	Does that really matter? (pause) It didn't to us	
DARON:	No, but it matters to your parents, doesn't it?	
LEAH:	What makes you say that?	
DARON:	It's obvious, Leah. Every time they talk to me, they're so politeso careful they say the right things	
LEAH:	Every time? But you hardly see them	



- DARON: Why do you think that is?
- LEAH: They are just being thoughtful...they don't want to offend you...
- DARON: But they feel awkward, I know they do
- LEAH: Daron...
- DARON: And so do I
- LEAH: But you're their son-in-law...
- DARON: Not by choice...I'm sure they wanted you to marry a Jewish man...
- LEAH: But I didn't fall in love with a Jewish man....I fell in love with you...
- DARON: Your parents must have said something to you...
- LEAH: About what?
- DARON: About how I don't see them...
- LEAH: They think they have offended you...
- DARON: I thought as much...
- LEAH: But Daron, what do you expect them to say? What do you expect them to do?
- DARON: Nothing really. They are Jews and I am a Gentile.
- LEAH: So aren't you being unfair on them?
- DARON: I think we both know where we stand.
- LEAH: So would you be happy if you didn't ever see them again?
- DARON: I'm not saying that...
- LEAH: What *are* you saying, Daron?
- DARON: Your parents are devout people...they keep the law of God as best they can. I'm the opposite, you know that. In fact, I was surprised when they allowed us to get married.

LEAH:	Of course, he's a Jew toowhy do you say it like that?	
(Daron looks at Lea	ah)	
LEAH:	It's not as though he's going to come between us

ABIGAIL:	That explains the silence
NATHAN:	I don't think Solomon needs to speak to the workers again
ABIGAIL:	Won't that be a good thing?
NATHAN:	What has Rachel been saying to you?
ABIGAIL:	She's been stating the obvious
NATHAN:	But Solomon's intentions are good
ABIGAIL:	Of course they are but it's how they are expressed to people. He is a Leader and you are left in no doubt of that when you talk to him.
NATHAN:	I know what you meanbut I still think his heart is in the right place
(Ezra enters)	
EZRA:	Hello Nathan

NATHAN:	Ezra! (Turning to Abigail) I don't think you've met Abigail
		, i don t dinin jour to mot , longuini

EZRA: Hello Abigail...

ABIGAIL: Nathan was telling me how you spoke to the workers

EZRA: Hopefully, they understood what I said...

NATHAN: I'm sure they did that....look, I better be getting home..

- EZRA: Can I come round later, Nathan? I'd like to have a word with you and Rachel.
- NATHAN: Yes, of course...Goodbye Abigail...
- ABIGAIL: Goodbye Nathan
- (Nathan leaves)
- EZRA: Have you lived here long, Abigail?
- ABIGAIL: All my life...
- EZRA: Did you ever think of moving to another town?
- ABIGAIL: I met my husband, Jacob, here. We both really liked this town so we decided to live here. We didn't have any children but we made a lot of friends. And that's really helped..
- EZRA: Has it?
- ABIGAIL: Since Jacob passed away...
- EZRA: I see.
- ABIGAIL: I can also find Jacob in this town...

EZRA: Can you?

- ABIGAIL: I can go to a place and think, "Jacob and I used to come here"...but I find being at home, on my own, very hard. I was used to him coming home from work but now I know he'll never again walk through that door.
- EZRA: I'm sorry to hear that...

EZRA:	Isn't she right?	
DARON:	(<i>Aaron nods</i>) At least, when I get home I can say you helped me. How long are you staying here?	
EZRA:	I've just arrived	
DARON:	Do you have family here?	
EZRA:	No, but I've met a few people alreadymy name is Ezra	
DARON:	Ezra? (<i>pause</i>) You've spoken to my wife	
EZRA:	Is your wife "Leah"?	
(Daron nods)		
EZRA:	You must be Daron	
(Ezra goes to shake Daron's' hand)		
EZRA:	What's the matter? Why won't you shake my hand?	

DARON:	Didn't Leah tell you I was a Gentile?
EZRA:	What difference does that make?
DARON:	You're a Jewwhat more do I have to say?
EZRA:	In the eyes of God, we are the same, but in your eyes, we are different.
DARON:	Of course we areGod has never been in my life, I've managed very well without him
EZRA:	I couldn't live my life without him
DARON:	Have you tried?
EZRA:	All I have to do is remember what my life was like before and what my life is like now
DARON:	So your life changedbut at what cost?
EZRA:	When does a change for the better involve hardship?
DARON:	I'm settledI don't need a change
EZRA:	We all need God
DARON:	You would say that, wouldn't you?
EZRA:	Not if I didn't believe it
(Daron turns away)	
EZRA:	Do you have any doubts, Daron?
DARON:	Doubts? About what?
EZRA:	About yourself. About your job. About your life
DARON:	Sometimesdon't you?
EZRA:	Of course I do, but you know there is one thing I can be sure of
DARON:	What's that?
EZRA:	God
DARON	And what does he do for you?



- EZRA: He helps me...he supports me...he guides me...he inspires me...who does that for you?
- DARON: I can help and support myself...
- EZRA: What about Leah?
- DARON: I know she loves me...
- EZRA: She does and she prays for you too..
- DARON: If she wants to do that, I'm not going to stop her...
- EZRA: Have you ever thought about praying with her?
- DARON: Why on earth would I do that?
- EZRA: You could get to know someone who will add something more to your life...
- DARON: What would that be?
- EZRA: A greater confidence, a greater strength, and a certainty
- DARON: A certainty of what?
- EZRA: That God will always be there for you...He will never turn His back on you.

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- NATHAN: I know, Ezra, we should have tried to stop them.
- EZRA: But you didn't....
- NATHAN: We made a mistake...
- RACHEL: We were thinking of Leah....she told us how happy she was with Daron...
- EZRA: But marrying him showed no respect to the word of God...
- RACHEL: It wasn't easy to tell them we approved...
- EZRA: Weren't they surprised?
- RACHEL: Of course....but it wasn't just that....
- EZRA: Do carry on....
- RACHEL: We have been through some very hard times, as you know, and when you have one disappointment after another, it affects you...
- EZRA: I can understand that....
- RACHEL: You start to think differently about things...you start to think differently about...
- EZRA: God?
- NATHAN: Where was He when we needed him? We thought he had deserted us....
- EZRA: What happened to you and your people was not God's will. God has no control over what you or I do, The Word of God tells us how we should lead our lives but some people choose to ignore or do not accept it...
- RACHEL: So what are we supposed to do? What does God expect us to do?
- EZRA: Don't lose your faith in Him. It can slip away, unnoticed and unrealized, until it recedes to a minimum. That is what has happened to you.
- NATHAN: But we did pray to God...



- EZRA: You did when you went through hard times...and then when you didn't get the answer you hoped for....
- RACHEL: But what good is God if He is not there when you really need Him?
- EZRA: But Rachel, he is there because he has promised never to leave us.. We are all going to face hardship, we are all going to experience hard times. This is when our faith is tested and this is when we have to remain strong,

(Solomon enters)

- SOLOMON: Ah, there you are..Nathan,,..Hello Ezra....
- EZRA: Hello Solomon....how are the workers?
- SOLOMON: They're fine and working hard....(T*urns to Nathan*) Can you come with me, Nathan....there is something I need to tell you....
- EZRA: Is it to do with the re-building work?
- SOLOMON: Yes, it is...
- EZRA: I'd like to come with you...
- SOLOMON: Yes, of course....tell me, Ezra, have you decided when you will be leaving us?
- EZRA: No, I have no plans yet of going back. I still have a lot of work to do and I'm sure they are more people I need to talk to...

(Leah and Daron arrive)

RACHEL:	Leahand Daron!!how lovely to seeboth of you
NATHAN:	Hello Daron,,,it's good to see you
EZRA:	Hello Daron
DARON:	Hello
RACHEL:	How are you, Daron? Leah tells us you have been working very hard



- DARON: I don't have much choice, really...there's a lot to do...which reminds me (*turning to Ezra*) thank you....
- EZRA: You've already thanked me for helping you...

- EZRA: Would you be here if it hadn't made any difference? (*Ezra turns to Nathan and Solomon*) Nathan..Solomon...we should go now...

(Ezra, Nathan and Solomon leave)

RACHEL; Are both of you staying? Would you like something to eat? We would love to share our meal...with both of you....

(Leah turns to Daron)

DARON: Why not?
